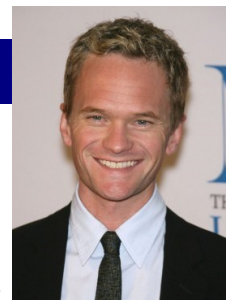

Neil Patrick Harris (born June 15, 1973) is an American actor, writer, producer, director, comedian, magician, singer, and television host. He is known for playing Barney Stinson in the television comedy series *How I Met Your Mother* (2005–2014), for which he was nominated for four Emmy Awards, and for his teenage role as the title character in *Doogie Howser, M.D.* (1989–1993).

Harris was named as one of *Time* magazine's 100 most influential people in 2010, and was awarded a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame in September 2011. He has hosted the Tony Awards on Broadway in 2009, 2011, 2012 and 2013, for which he won several special class Emmy Awards. He also hosted the Primetime Emmy Awards in 2009 and 2013, and hosted the 87th Academy Awards in 2015, thus making him the first openly gay man to host the Academy Awards.

Harris was born in Albuquerque, New Mexico and grew up in the town of Ruidoso, New Mexico. His parents, Sheila (Née Scott) and Ronald Gene Harris, were lawyers and ran a restaurant. He attended La Cueva High School in Albuquerque, graduating with high honors in 1991.

Harris is a fan of magic, like his character on *How I Met Your Mother*. He serves as the President of the Board of Directors of Hollywood's Magic Castle. Harris won the Tannen's Magic Louis Award in 2006 and hosted the 2008 World Magic Awards on October 11, 2008. Additionally, Harris and partner David Burtka were guests of honour for a *Top Chef Masters* episode which took place at the Magic Castle. Harris also performed magic in his Emmy-winning performance on *Glee*.

Harris attended the Emmy Awards in September 2007 with his fiancé David Burtka, later confirming the relationship. In an interview on *The Ellen DeGeneres Show*, Harris said his relationship with Burtka began in 2004. On August 14, 2010, Harris announced that he and Burtka were expecting twins via a surrogate mother. Their son, Gideon Scott, and daughter, Harper Grace, were born on October 12, 2010.

Recipe For Trifle Cake

Ingredients—For the Syrup:

Grated zest of 1 orange
Juice of 2 oranges
3tbsp caster sugar
2tbsp Grand Marnier or Cointreau

For The Cake:

Small panettone
800ml (32fl oz) whipped cream
Zest of 1 orange
2tbsp caster sugar
2 punnets raspberries
Toasted flaked almonds, to decorate

METHOD

To make the syrup combine the zest, juice and sugar in a small saucepan and bring to the boil, stirring to dissolve the sugar. Simmer for 1 minute then leave to cool. Stir in the alcohol.

Remove the paper from the panettone and trim off and discard the top. Cut the panettone into 3 or 4 rounds. Brush or drizzle each of the rounds with the syrup.

Beat the cream, orange zest and caster sugar together until it forms soft peaks.

Place one of the rounds on a platter and cover with a layer of whipped cream. Top with one third of the raspberries. Repeat with the remaining panettone rounds, drizzle with any remaining syrup. You will now have a three-layered cake. Cover the top of the cake with cream, topping with the remaining raspberries and the toasted almonds. Serve immediately, or chill for up to 2 hours.

Red Rover

Red Rover was a common outdoor game for kids during my childhood, and it probably dates back a very long way before that! I suggest adult supervision!

You need quite a large group of children for the game to work best.



Divide the children into two teams and choose a leader for each team. The kids form into two parallel lines opposite each other, and join hands (or join wrists).

The leader of one team chooses one player from the opposite team and invites them to play by calling "red rover, red rover, let *child's name* come over!"

That player called then runs at the opposing team and tries to hurl himself through the children, breaking the chain. If he fails, he joins that chain, and the turn passes to the other side.

The game ends when one team has all but one of the players in their chain

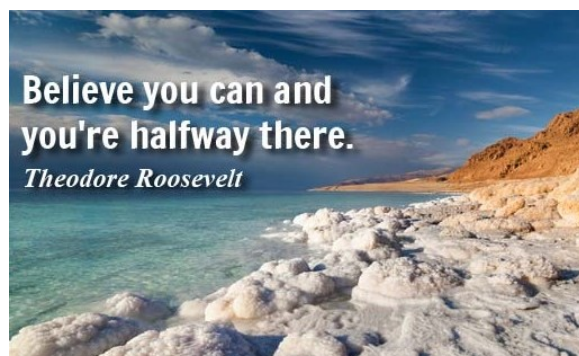

Gardening Tips!

June finds that weeds are thriving, so keep on top of the situation; hoe on warm days and leave them on the surface to wither and die in the sun. If it's dry, attack weeds with systemic weed killer painted onto the leaves, and trail tips of bindweed into jam jars full of the same. Remember systemic weed killers are indiscriminate and will kill anything they contact.

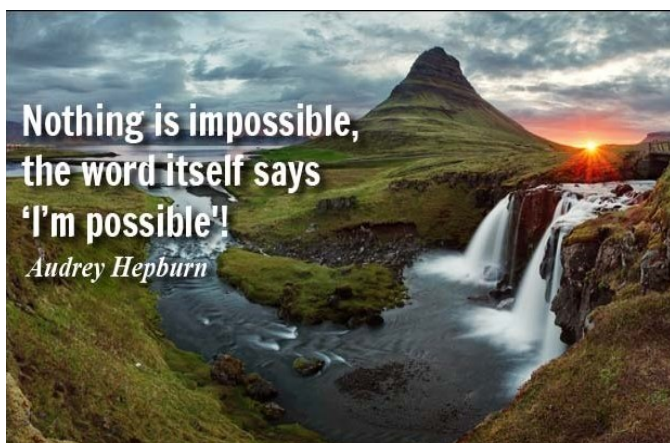
Water is a precious commodity – instigate good practices such as using kitchen and bath water (as long as it is neither too dirty, greasy nor full of detergent) for watering, collect rainwater and investigate ways to recycle water for your irrigation. Avoid using tap water, however, for lime-hating plants such as camellias.



Automatic watering systems are economical with water, as well as convenient, so consider installing one sooner rather than later.

Watering is essential once the weather is drier and warmer - water thoroughly once or twice a week rather than little and often (containers and hanging baskets need watering every day and sometimes even twice a day if it is hot and windy) - this encourages plants to put down roots in search of water rather than coming up to the surface. For large shrubs or trees, leave a hose trickling around the base for an hour.

Carry on removing moss and weeds from paths, terraces and drives and keep an eye out for pests around the garden. Try to keep the use of chemical controls to a minimum - they may kill off pests, but they also kill off the beneficial insects that prey on them such as ladybirds and hoverfly larvae.



Continue the campaign against slugs and snails. They love the young shoots of delphiniums and the like, so use pet-friendly slug pellets, drench the ground around hostas with liquid slug killer to exterminate slugs below the surface or invest in a biological control (this employs nematodes to deliver a slug-lethal bacterial infection) - all are available from the garden centre. Keep an eye out for snails and pick them off.
